Smartsheet (https://www.smartsheet.com/?opty=noredirect) is a web based work collaboration platform that has immense potential to transform Pierce, propel it forward to meet and exceed expectations, and overcome existing and future challenges through enhanced communication, collaboration, and workspace management.

I have been using it for about two years, mostly for Plant 2, but will be expanding its use throughout Pierce as a whole.

There is so much to say about it and not enough space in this newsletter to do it justice, so I'll hit some key points. On November 13, 2019, we will be having our annual Managers meeting and I will provide more in depth information and demonstrations then. For now, consider and imagine these things becoming a reality at your facility.

What you can get:

High level metrics that describe key information about the facility

Centralized, web based repository of operational documentation like contracts, agreements, work instructions, forms, checklists, etc.

Interactive dashboards that depict key performance indicators

Quantitative customized reports sent at predefined and adjustable intervals to key decision makers

Individual Associate, team, departmental, and facility metrics, charts, and graphs that may be view only or interactive

What you can do with these things and why they will drive continual improvement:

The right people will know the right things at the right time so that they may make critical decisions faster and with less effort

Quick access to key data or other forms of information combined with collaborative application attributes ease the process of tracking progress towards goals and objectives

Know what you are up against in terms of deadlines, milestones, and expectations

Make decisions faster, de-conflict interests, and keep conversations in context without having to search outlook folders for emails that are hard to distinguish from others

The slogan of Smartsheet is, "Achieve More" and Pierce can indeed achieve more...but it will need to embrace change first because no real improvement can be made without change.

What Is Metabolic Syndrome?

Basically, "metabolic syndrome" is the name for a group of five health risk factors. To be diagnosed with metabolic syndrome, you must have at least three of the five risk factors:

1	A Large, Round Waistline Excess fat around the stomach is a bigger predictor of coronary heart disease than excess fat stored in other parts of the body.
2	High Triglyceride Levels Your body converts calories it can't immediately use into triglycerides, which are a type of fat found in the blood. High levels also lead to coronary heart disease.
3	Low HDL Cholesterol Levels The so-called "good" cholesterol, HDL helps remove cholesterol from your arteries. That means low HDL cholesterol levels can lead to clogged arteries and coronary heart disease.
1	High Blood Pressure Blood pressure measures the force of your blood pushing against the walls of your arteries as your heart pumps. Higher than normal blood pressure can be triggered by your diet and/or abnormal stress, and it can damage your heart over time.
	High Fasting Blood Sugar (Glucose)

It's important to know this number, as high blood sugar is often an early indicator
